1780, 14 September Ordered to be built (A.1/141, pp. 19-20)
1781, 7 March Named *King George* (A.1/141, p 75)
1797 Sprang a leak, docked at Gravesend (A.1/47, fo. 98)
1811, May Sold to Messrs. Daniel and Samuel Brent & Sons
(A.1/50, fos. 28, 30d-31; C.1/295, 1 July 1811)
1812 Hudson's Bay Company chartered the ship (A.1/50, fos. 54d, 59, 61, 74)
1813 The ship was offered to the Hudson's Bay Company for £5,400 - was declined
