PROVINCE OF MANITOBA NOTES TO THE QUARTERLY FINANCIAL REPORT FOR THE SIX MONTHS - APRIL TO SEPTEMBER 2000

This report presents the unaudited financial results of the Province of Manitoba for the second quarter of the 2000/2001 fiscal year. The comparative data provided for the 1999/2000 fiscal year has been restated to reflect the organizational structure of departments established in the 2000/2001 Estimates.

This report incorporates the reporting changes announced in the 2000 Budget. As noted in the Budget, withdrawals from the Fiscal Stabilization Fund are identified separately and no longer included as revenue to the Operating Fund. Financing for health capital and Manitoba Lotteries Corporation have been brought under the provincial umbrella to reduce costs and increase transparency. As well, debt retirement provisions have been broadened to include pension liabilities as well as general purpose debt, thereby beginning to address the Province's outstanding pension liabilities for our employees and teachers.

SECOND QUARTER - ACTUAL TO ESTIMATE

The net expenditure for the six months ended September 30, 2000 of \$193.3 million was \$17.9 million lower than the projection of \$211.2 million. Expenditures were \$29.2 million less than the six month plan and revenues were \$11.3 million lower than anticipated resulting in the variance. The variance is primarily attributable to differences in timing between the flow of receipts and disbursements.

SECOND QUARTER COMPARED TO PREVIOUS YEAR'S RESULTS

Second quarter expenditure of \$3,119.3 million was \$153.0 million higher than for the same period last year and revenue of \$2,926.0 million was up by \$136.3 million resulting in a \$16.7 million increase in net expenditure. The increased expenditure primarily reflects the higher level of expenditure approved in the 2000 Budget for the departments of Health, Education and Training, Family Services and Housing, and Justice. The improvement in revenue mainly reflects projected revenue growth included in the 2000 Budget.

The \$75.0 million decrease in Interfund Transfers from the previous year results from a difference in timing of the transfer for debt retirement which will occur later in the 2000/01 fiscal year.

YEAR END PROJECTION

The 2000/01 year-end surplus is now forecast to be \$13.7 million, a slight increase from the \$9.9 million surplus forecast in the 2000 Budget.

Revenues are projected to increase by \$122.2 million from the budget estimate. This increase results primarily from revised estimates of the provincial share of equalization payments and revised projections of corporation income tax revenue. Lottery revenue is also projected to increase.

Expenditures are projected to increase as a result of the impact of poorer than expected performance of the Canadian dollar on public debt costs as well as: higher than anticipated expenditures in agriculture; emergency expenditures related to spring flooding and forest fires; and health.

BORROWING ACTIVITY

The original estimate of borrowing requirements identified in the 2000 Budget was \$2,402.8 million, including all refinancing and funding for health capital. This requirement has increased to \$2,581.7 million primarily as a result of financing in support of the Manitoba Lotteries Corporation and reduced requirements for Manitoba Hydro. The revised estimate includes \$1,836.5 million for refinancing maturing debt issues with the balance required for self-sustaining programs, including Manitoba Hydro, and to fund an allocation to the Provincial Sinking Fund for the repurchase of foreign debt.

For the period April 1, 2000 to September 30, 2000, \$1,742.8 million has been borrowed; \$432.6 million was raised through the issue of Builder Bonds Series 6 (the second highest amount ever raised through this financing method) with the remainder raised in the public market.
