Citing Beauchesne citation 417, he asserted that in answering questions during Question Period both the Minister of Family Services and the Minister of Education were not relevant to the questions posed. I took the matter under advisement in order to review Hansard.

As Beauchesne citation states, answers to questions should be brief, should deal with the matter raised, and should not provoke debate. The Opposition House Leader did have a point of order. The Minister of Education and the Minister of Family Services were not complying with citation 417. Ministers should provide brief, relevant and non-provocative answers.
