PRAYER

1:30 O'CLOCK P.M.

Immediately following the Prayer, Mr. HAWRANIK rose on a Matter of Privilege regarding Hansard's transcription of statements spoken in the House and moved:

THAT this Matter of Privilege I have raised be referred to the Standing Committee on Legislative Affairs.

WHEREUPON Mr. Speaker ruled there was no Matter of Privilege.

On motion of Mr. GRAYDON, Bill (No. 229) – The Manitoba Public Insurance Corporation Amendment Act (Justice for Victims of Serious Automobile Accidents)/Loi modifiant la Loi sur la Société d'assurance publique du Manitoba (justice pour les victimes d'accidents d'automobile graves), was read a First Time and had its purposes outlined.

The following petitions were presented and read:

Mr. LAMOUREUX – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to request that the Premier of Manitoba consider how important it is to have the Seven Oaks Hospital provide full emergency services seven days a week 24 hours a day. (A. Martin, D. Cometa, J. Jaramilla and others)

Mr. BRIESE – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to urge the Minister of Health to consider prioritizing the needs of these communities by ensuring they have access to a family doctor and to consider promptly increasing the use of nurse practitioners in these communities in order to improve access to quality health care. (C. Gulas, L. Lecunff, B. Drysdale and others)

Mr. DYCK – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to urge the Minister of Health to ensure that patients who are awaiting placement in a personal care home are not moved to distant communities and to consider working with the RHA and the community to speed construction and expansion of long term care facilities in the region. (B. Bestland, M. Penner, M. Wiebe and others)

Mr. SCHULER – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to request that the Minister of Transportation consider the immediate installation of traffic signals at the intersection of PTH #15 and Highway #206 in Dugald and to recognize the value of the lives and well-being of the students and citizens of Manitoba. (C. Reynolds, D. Moyses, D. Moyses and others)

Mr. BOROTSIK – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to request that the Minister of Education Citizenship and Youth consider removing education funding by school tax or education levies from all property in Manitoba and consider finding a more equitable method of funding education such as general revenue following the Constitutional funding of education by the Province of Manitoba. (M. Poncik, D. Lischka, J. Berry and others)
