**PRAYER** 10:00 O'CLOCK A.M.

By leave, it was agreed for the House to deal with Second Reading of Bill (No. 205). Mrs. DRIEDGER moved: THAT Bill (No. 205) - The Regional Health Authorities Amendment Act (Mammography Accreditation)/Loi modifiant la Loi sur les offices régionaux de la santé (homologation des mammographes), be now read a Second Time and be referred to a Committee of this House. And a debate arising, And Mrs. Driedger, Hon. Mr. Mackintosh, Mrs. Stefanson, Hon. Ms. Howard, Mrs. TAILLIEU and Ms. McGIFFORD having spoken, And Mr. MARTINDALE speaking at 11:00 a.m. The debate was allowed to remain in his name. In accordance with Rule 31(9), the Opposition House Leader announced that the Bipole cost increase updates Resolution will be considered next Thursday, June 2, 2011.

Mr. SCHULER moved:

Resolution No. 13: Mandatory Bed Bug Reporting

WHEREAS bed bugs are the cause of significant financial and psychological strain on those affected by cimex lectularius; and

WHEREAS the incidence of bed bugs in Manitoba has been growing at a rapid pace over the past years; and

WHEREAS Manitoba Housing buildings and clients are particularly affected by bed bugs; and

WHEREAS the Provincial Government has yet to provide an adequate response plan to the increased presence of bed bugs in Manitoba in general and in Manitoba Housing buildings in particular; and

WHEREAS the Government of Saskatchewan introduced an act requiring landlords to provide current and prospective tenants with a report on bedbugs at the rental premises; and

WHEREAS Manitobans have the right to know about the presence of bed bugs in any premises in which they may choose to live.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislative Assembly of Manitoba urge the Provincial Government to implement legislation requiring landlords to provide prospective tenants with a report on any bed bug occurrence at the rental premises.

Mr. GERRARD – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to request the Minister of Health to consider holding the BRHA board and the management team accountable for their actions; to consider replacing the BRHA senior management; to consider ensuring the BRHA hires public health specialists and third party human resource and financial consultants to audit the working and financial running of the authority and to consider ensuring that the BRHA initiates adequate public health programs.
