PRAYER 1:30 O'CLOCK P.M.

On motion of Mr. GOERTZEN, Bill (No. 220) – The Justice for Victims of Child Pornography Act/Loi sur l'indemnisation des victimes de pornographie juvénile, was read a First Time and had its purposes outlined.

Mr. BRIESE – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to request the Minister of Infrastructure and Transportation to consider the importance of reducing the speed limit on PTH 5 to 80 km/hour in the vicinity of the Town of Ste. Rose from the west side of the Turtle River bridge to the south side of the access to the Ste. Rose Auction Mart to help better protect motorist safety. (P. Sigurdson, L. Gagnon, L. Mr. GOERTZEN – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to request the Minister of Justice to consider ensuring that all court orders for car thieves are vigorously monitored and enforced and to consider ensuing all breaches of court orders on car thieves are reported to police and vigorously prosecuted. Mr. PEDERSEN – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to urge the Provincial Government to build the Bipole III transmission line on the shorter and more reliable east side of Lake Winnipeg, in order to save each Manitoba family of four \$11,748. (M. Wiebe, D. Frost, M. Graafland and others)

Mrs. ROWAT asked Written Questions (Nos. 26 to 30) for reply to the following:

- 26. Could the Minister of Health explain what the delay is in implementing and mandating a province-wide universal newborn hearing screening program?
- 27. Will the Minister of Health provide details of the great deal of empirical research that identifies the outcomes of early intervention for children with hearing loss and attests to the benefits of early intervention?
- 28. Could the Minister of Health provide evidence to dispute the contention that early identification of hearing loss will result in fewer requirements for services as the child enters school? For example, signing interpreters, deaf and Hard of Hearing consultants, Ministry involvement, school classroom modifications to reduce sound levels, etc.
- 29. Could the Minister of Health provide a detailed explanation if she does not agree that universal newborn hearing screening can be performed by any audiologist or public health nurse provided they are properly trained?
- 30. Could the Minister of Health explain what steps would have to be taken to implement universal screening programs in Winnipeg similar to those in rural Manitoba?
