Mr. PEDERSEN – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to urge the Provincial Government to build the Bipole III transmission line on the shorter and more reliable east side of Lake Winnipeg, in order to save each Manitoba family of four \$11,748. (L. Sanders, D. Darling, L. Schultz and others)

Mr. MAGUIRE – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to request the Provincial Government to consider enacting a compensation program to help address the extra costs facing agricultural producers due to severe flooding in the Rural Municipality of Sifton and to consider developing a long-term strategy to more effectively address future flooding events in the R.M of Sifton.
