PRAYER 1:30 O'CLOCK P.M.

On motion of Mrs. GUILLEMARD, Bill (No. 230) –The Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder Awareness Day Act/Loi sur la Journée de sensibilisation à l'ensemble des troubles causés par l'alcoolisation fœtale, was read a First Time and had its purposes outlined.

Hon. Mr. SCHULER, the Minister of Infrastructure, made a statement regarding the status of Manitoba fires.

 $Mr.\ MALOWAY$ and, by leave, Hon. $Mr.\ GERRARD$ commented on the statement.

Pursuant to Rule 27(1), Hon. Mr. SCHULER and Messrs. LINDSEY, MICKLEFIELD and KINEW made Members' Statements.

The following petitions were presented and read:

Ms. FONTAINE – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to urge the Premier of Manitoba and the Minister of Justice to immediately call a Public Inquiry into the systems that had a role in the life and death of Tina Fontaine as well as the function of the administration of justice after her death and that the terms of reference of a Public Inquiry be developed jointly with the caregivers of Tina Fontaine and/or the agent appointed by them.

Hon. Mr. FLETCHER – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to urge the Provincial Government to take the necessary steps to ensure that the Vimy Arena site is not used for an addiction treatment facility and to take the necessary steps to ensure the preservation of public land along Sturgeon Creek for the purposes of park land and recreational activities for public use (including being an important component of the Sturgeon Creek Greenway Trail and the Sturgeon Creek ecosystem) under the current designation of PR2 for the 255 Hamilton Avenue location at the Vimy Arena site, and to maintain the land to continue to be designated for Parks and Recreation Active Neighbourhood/Community. Hon. Mr. GERRARD – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to urge the Provincial Government to request Dynacare to reopen the closed laboratories or allow Diagnostic Services of Manitoba to freely open labs in clinics which formerly housed labs that have been shut down by Dynacare and to ensure high quality lab services for patients, and a level playing field and competition in the provision of laboratory services to medical offices as well to address this matter immediately in the interest of better patient focused care and improved support for health professionals. The House resumed the debate on the Proposed Motion of Hon. Ms. SQUIRES:

THAT Bill (No. 7) – The Sustainable Watersheds Act (Various Acts Amended)/Loi sur les bassins hydrographiques durables (modification de diverses dispositions législatives), as amended and reported from the Standing Committee on Legislative Affairs, be concurred in, read a Third Time and passed.

And Hon. Mr. FLETCHER having spoken,

And the Question being put. It was agreed to.

The Bill was accordingly concurred in, read a Third Time and passed.

Hon. Mr. FRIESEN moved:

Bill (No. 23) – The Commodity Futures Amendment and Securities Amendment Act/Loi modifiant la Loi sur les contrats à terme de marchandises et la Loi sur les valeurs mobilières, as amended and reported from the Standing Committee on Human Resources, be concurred in, read a Third Time and passed

And a debate arising,

And Hon. Mr. FRIESEN, Mr. WIEBE and Hon. Messrs. GERRARD and FLETCHER having spoken,

And the Question being put. It was agreed to.

The Bill was accordingly concurred in, read a Third Time and passed

Hon. Mrs. COX moved:

THAT Bill (No. 15) – The Film and Video Classification and Distribution Act/Loi sur la classification et la distribution des films et des vidéos, reported from the Standing Committee on Social and Economic Development, be concurred in and be now read a Third Time and passed.

And a debate arising,

And Hon. Mrs. Cox, Ms. MARCELINO (Logan), Ms. LAMOUREUX and Hon. Mr. FLETCHER having spoken,

And the Question being put. It was agreed to.

The Bill was accordingly concurred in, read a Third Time and passed.

Hon. Mr. FIELDING moved:

THAT Bill (No. 18) – The Child and Family Services Amendment Act (Taking Care of Our Children)/Loi modifiant la Loi sur les services à l'enfant et à la famille (soins conformes aux traditions), reported from the Standing Committee on Legislative Affairs, be concurred in and be now read a Third Time and passed.

And a debate arising,

And Hon. Mr. FIELDING, Ms. FONTAINE and Hon. Messrs. GERRARD and FLETCHER having spoken,

And the Question being put. It was agreed to.

The Bill was accordingly concurred in, read a Third Time and passed.

Hon Mr. CULLEN for Hon. Mr. FRIESEN moved:

THAT Bill (No. 5) – The Public Interest Disclosure (Whistleblower Protection) Amendment Act/Loi modifiant la Loi sur les divulgations faites dans l'intérêt public (protection des divulgateurs d'actes répréhensibles), reported from the Standing Committee on Human Resources, be concurred in and be now read a Third Time and passed.

And a debate arising,

And Hon. Mr. CULLEN, Mr. WIEBE and Hon. Mr. GERRARD having spoken,

And Hon. Mr. FLETCHER speaking at 5:00 p.m. The debate was allowed to remain in his name.
