PROPOSED RESOLUTION:

Mr. REID – Apprenticeship

5. WHEREAS apprenticeship programs are critical to the provision of skills training for Manitoba's young people; and

WHEREAS the supply of skilled tradespeople is critical to the economic development of the province; and

WHEREAS many current and future large construction projects such as the floodway and northern hydroelectric development require a steady supply of skilled tradespeople; and

WHEREAS apprenticeship is an effective partnership between business and labour; and

WHEREAS the number of registered apprentices in Manitoba has increased by 43% since 1999, from 3,700 to 5,306 registrants; and

WHEREAS the number of aboriginal registrants in the apprenticeship programs has nearly tripled since 1999, representing an increase from 350 to 982; and

WHEREAS community college enrolment has increased from 11,049 to 14,718 students, representing a 33% increase since 1999, demonstrating the effects of this government's investment on post-secondary education including the ongoing tuition freeze and investments in new buildings and programs.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Legislative Assembly of Manitoba urge the Government of Manitoba continue to invest resources in apprenticeship programs in order to ensure that workers receive effective training in the skilled trades; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Government of Manitoba continue to work in partnership with Manitoba employers and to consider expanding apprenticeship programs in order to ensure that the Manitoba economy has the skilled tradespeople it requires to continue to grow.
