

RESOLUTION:

Mr. EICHLER – Manitoba Hydro Rate Hikes Harming Manitoba Families

19. WHEREAS residential electricity rates have increased by 27%, considerably more than double the rate of inflation since the Member for St. Boniface became Premier; and

WHEREAS electricity rates are expected to double over the next 20 years due to annual increases of 4%; and

WHEREAS the Public Utilities Board has expressed concerns about potentially larger than anticipated costs at Manitoba Hydro which could result in the possibility of more rate increases in the future.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislative Assembly of Manitoba acknowledge that these rate hikes compound the financial hardship on Manitoba families imposed by the Provincial Government through tax and fee increases such as the 2012 broadening and deepening of the Provincial Sales Tax and the 2013 hiking of the Provincial Sales Tax from seven to eight per cent.

RESOLUTION:

Ms. LATHLIN – Provincial Government Support for Northerners’ Health

18. WHEREAS Manitoban families expect their health care system to offer high quality and safe patient care and the Provincial Government agrees that northern Manitoban families should expect such care; and

WHEREAS the Provincial Government has invested in upgrading northern hospitals and personal care homes as well as building Cancer Hubs, renal health centres and addiction treatment centres to make a wider variety of health care more accessible; and

WHEREAS the Provincial Government has created return of service programs and is covering tuitions for medical and nursing students who commit to working in northern communities; and

WHEREAS at-risk young people struggling with mental health and addictions issues can access care centres to get help and have a safe place to stay; and

WHEREAS the Provincial Government continues to make good on its commitments to upgrade the Provincial highways network to allow safe and reliable transportation to and from health care facilities across the Province; and

WHEREAS the Provincial Government has introduced new programs which support local food self-sufficiency and create retail subsidies to make healthy food more accessible and affordable in the north; and

WHEREAS the Leader of the Official Opposition and his caucus don’t consider the north a priority, don’t want to invest in northern health care and cut nearly \$8 million from northern hospitals the last time he was in government.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislative Assembly of Manitoba urge the Provincial Government to continue to reject calls for cuts and privatization, and continue to work hard to build a health care system which better meets northern families’ expectations; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislative Assembly of Manitoba urge the Provincial Government to continue to draw the Federal Government's attention to northern issues and work with Prime Minister Trudeau and northern communities to find solutions that help northern Manitobans.
