THIS LICENCE IS ISSUED TO:

THE PROVINCE OF MANITOBA REPRESENTED BY THE MINISTER OF HIGHWAYS AND TRANSPORTATION: The "Licencee"

for the construction and operation of the Development being the upgrading of Provincial Trunk Highway #21 beginning one half mile north of Provincial Road #259 in the Rural Municipality of Woodworth and extending in a northerly direction to the south boundary of the Village of Hamiota in the Rural Municipality of Hamiota subject to the following specifications, limits, terms and conditions:

SPECIFICATIONS, LIMITS, TERMS, AND CONDITIONS

- The Licencee shall construct the Development in accordance with the Department of Highways & Transportation Environment Act Proposal, Proposed Upgrading of Provincial Trunk Highway #21 (from 1/2 mile north of P.R. #259 to the south boundary of the Village of Hamiota), filed on March 24, 1993.
- 2) The Licencee shall, prior to construction startup, instruct the on-site project construction supervisor to contact the Manitoba Environment, Brandon Office, to ensure compliance with the terms of this Licence and other applicable regulatory requirements.
- 3) The Licencee shall, prior to construction, reach an agreement with Manitoba Environment, Park-West Region, on the location of the asphalt batching plant associated with the Development.
- 4) The Licencee shall not obtain borrow material for the Development from SW 8-14-23W.
- 5) The Licencee shall, following completion of construction, remove all access roads to borrow sites associated with the Development.
- 6) The Licencee shall ensure that all fuel storage areas associated with the Development comply with the requirements of Manitoba Regulation 97/88R respecting Storage and Handling of Gasoline and Associated Products.

7) The Licencee shall, during the full term of the construction of the Development, cleanup and deposit all debris from the construction site at a Waste Disposal Ground operating under the authority of a permit pursuant to Manitoba Regulation 150/91R respecting Waste Disposal Grounds.

REVOCATION

If in the opinion of the Director the Licencee has exceeded or is exceeding the limits, or has not complied or is not complying with the specifications, terms or conditions set out herein, the Director may revoke, temporarily or permanently, this Licence.
