THIS LICENCE IS ISSUED TO:

PUBLIC WORKS AND GOVERNMENT SERVICES CANADA: "the Licencee" Stage 2 Licence

for the construction of the Development being repairs to the fixed dam and piers of the St. Andrews Lock and Dam on the Red River at Lockport, subject to the following specifications, limits, terms and conditions:

Specifications, Limits, Terms and Conditions

- 1. The Licencee shall construct Stage 2 of the Development in accordance with the report Fixed Dam Repairs St. Andrews Lock and Dam Lockport, Manitoba Preliminary Design Report (Abridged), dated June, 1994 and prepared for the Licencee by Acres International Limited, and the additional information provided by the Licencee, dated August 9, 1994.
- 2. The Licencee shall, prior to the commencement of construction of Stage 2 of the Development, submit plans for the approval of the Director for the design and construction details of the downstream structural cofferdams.
- 3. The Licencee shall ensure that erosion and the introduction of sediment into the Red River is controlled and minimized during the construction of the Development.
- 4. The Licencee shall, prior to the commencement of construction of the Development, receive the approval of the Director for a monitoring program for sediment loading downstream of the Development during the construction period. The monitoring program shall be developed in consultation with staff from Manitoba Environment.
- 5. The Licencee shall notify Manitoba Environment and Manitoba Natural Resources (Central Region) not less than one week prior to the dewatering of areas enclosed by the downstream cofferdams.
- 6. The Licencee shall ensure that material used in the construction of the Development is non-toxic to aquatic life.
- 7. The Licencee shall dispose of demolition waste and waste construction material at a Waste Disposal Ground operating under the authority of a permit issued pursuant to Manitoba Regulation 150/91R respecting Waste Disposal Grounds.

- 8. The Licencee shall ensure that all used oil products and other regulated hazardous wastes generated by the machinery used in the construction of the Development are collected and disposed of in accordance with applicable Manitoba Environment and legislation requirements.
- 9. The Licencee shall ensure that fuel storage areas established for the construction of the Development shall comply with the requirements of Manitoba Regulation 97/88R respecting Storage and Handling of Gasoline and Associated Products.

Revocation

If, in the opinion of the Director, the Licencee has exceeded or is exceeding the limits, or has not complied or is not complying with the specifications, terms or conditions set out herein, the Director may revoke this Licence either temporarily or permanently.
