THIS LICENCE IS ISSUED TO:

## THE RURAL MUNICIPALITY OF STANLEY: "the Licencee"

for the construction and operation of the Development being a diversion of a waterway from the east side of 12-3-4W along the east side of sections 12, 13 and 24-3-4W to Deadhorse Creek in the Rural Municipality of Stanley, subject to the following specifications, limits, terms and conditions:

## SPECIFICATIONS, LIMITS, TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 1. The Licencee shall construct the Development in accordance with the Environment Act Proposal dated June 7, 1994, and the additional information dated December 15, 1994, submitted to Manitoba Environment by the Licencee.
- 2. The Licencee shall maintain a riparian flow in the natural channel downstream (east) of the diversion. This shall be accomplished through the provision of a small diameter culvert through the north-south municipal road set at the bottom of the natural channel at the location where the diversion begins.
- 3. The Licencee shall ensure that no construction or maintenance which would affect sedimentation in Deadhorse Creek occurs between April 1 and June 15 of any year.
- 4. The Licencee shall ensure that soil disturbed by the construction of the development is revegetated with a mixture of native or introduced grasses or legumes.
- 5. The Licencee shall ensure that adequate precautions are taken to prevent erosion where the diversion enters Deadhorse Creek.
- 6. The Licencee shall ensure that all used oil products and other regulated hazardous wastes generated by the machinery used in the construction and operation of the Development are collected and disposed of in accordance with all applicable Manitoba Environment and legislation requirements.
- 7. The Licencee shall ensure that fuel storage areas established for the construction and operation of the Development shall comply with the requirements of Manitoba Regulation 97/88R respecting Storage and Handling of Gasoline and Associated Products.
