for the construction of the Development being the upgrading of a section of Provincial Road #373 beginning at the Rossville junction and extending a distance of 11.1 km. northerly subject to the following specifications, limits, terms and conditions:

SPECIFICATIONS, LIMITS, TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 1. The Licencee shall construct the Development in accordance with the Manitoba Department of Highways and Transportation Location Plan of P.R. #373 (from Rossville junction 11.1 km north), filed as part of the Environment Act Proposal, dated November 8, 1994.
- 2. The Licencee shall, prior to construction, obtain a work permit from the Manitoba Department of Natural Resources Norway House detachment.
- 3. The Licencee shall, during the demolition and construction of the relocated Little Pine Creek crossing adhere to the Manitoba Department of Natural Resources guidelines titled Recommended Fish Protection Procedures for Stream Crossings in Manitoba.
- 4. The Licencee shall, during the rehabilitation or construction of any timber bridges related to the Development, not use timbers treated with cresosote or pentachlorophenol.
- 5. The Licencee shall, during construction, salvage and utilize locally merchantable timber from the Development in accordance with the Department of Natural Resources timber permit.
- 6. The Licencee shall, during construction, ensure that all fuel storage areas established for the construction of the Development are located a minimum distance of 100 meters away from all lakes and streams, and shall comply with the requirements of Manitoba Regulation 97/88R respecting Storage and Handling of Gasoline and Associated Products Regulation.

7. The Licencee shall, during the full term of the construction of the Development, cleanup and deposit all debris from the construction site at a Waste Disposal Ground operating under the authority of a permit issued pursuant to *Manitoba Regulation 150/91R* respecting *Waste Disposal Grounds*.

If in the opinion of the Director the Licencee has exceeded or is exceeding the limits, or has not or is not complying with the specifications, terms and conditions set out herein, the Director may revoke temporarily or permanently, this Licence.
