## MANITOBA HYDRO: " the Licencee"

subject to the following specifications, limits, terms and conditions for the construction, operation, and maintenance of the Development known as the ST2 to Beausejour East Station 115 kV Transmission Line. The Development involves the construction of a 115 kV transmission line originating from the GT1/ST2 double circuit transmission line located approximately eight kilometers south of Beausejour and terminating near the Beausejour East Station located at the south east end of the Town of Beausejour.

## SPECIFICATIONS, LIMITS, TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 1) The Licencee shall construct the Development in accordance with the ST2 to Beausejour East Station 115 kV Transmission Line Environment Impact Statement, March 1995, filed in support of the Environment Act Proposal, dated March 17, 1995.
- The Licencee shall submit to the Director prior to commencement of construction activities for the Development, a ST2 to Beausejour East Station 115 kV Transmission Line Project Environmental Protection Plan. The Plan shall describe the approach to be used by the Licencee to monitor environmental conditions both during and after construction in order to ensure that mitigative measures are applied systematically and in a manner consistent with the commitments made in the ST2 to Beausejour East Station 115 kV Transmission Line Environment Impact Statement, March 1995.
- The Licencee shall, within wetland areas related to the Development use wood poles treated with chromated copper arsenate (CCA).
- 4) The Licencee shall, during construction of the Development, ensure that any fuel storage areas established for the construction are located at a minimum distance of 100 metres away from waterbodies, and ensure the storage areas comply with the requirements of Manitoba Regulation 97/88R Storage and Handling of Gasoline and Associated Products Regulation.
- 5) The Licencee shall, during and upon completion of construction of the Development, collect and dispose of all waste petroleum products and containers and other regulated hazardous wastes in accordance with all applicable regulatory requirements.

The Licencee shall, during the full term of the construction of the Development, cleanup and dispose of all debris from the construction at a Waste Disposal Ground operating under the authority of a permit pursuant to the Manitoba Waste Disposal Ground Regulation, MR 150/91.

## REVOCATION

If in the opinion of the Director, the Licencee has not complied or is not complying with the specifications, limits, terms or conditions set out herein, the Director may revoke, temporarily or permanently, this Licence.
