SPECIFICATIONS, LIMITS, TERMS AND CONDY ONS

- 1. The Licencee shall ensure the volume of softwood barvests, does not exceed 24,153.85 m³, and the volume of hardwood harvests, does not seed 2,03° kg m³, as identified in the 1995/96 Quota Holder Annual Harvest, Plan.
- 2. The Licencee shall ensure that all harvest and as rejated divities occur within the geographical boundaries of Forest Management of the property of the specific dividentified in the 1995/96 Quota Holder Annual House Man and associate traps.
- 3. The Licencee shall carry out has est and as ciated activities in accordance with practices set out in "Forest Ma temen Wildlife in Manitoba". "Recommended Buffer Zons for A ng Fish Resources in Lakes and Streams in Forest Cutting Areas", l "Reco nended Fish Protection Procedures for Stream Crossings in Manitoba nd any er provincial guidelines which may be adopted for forest 4110 ent ac
- 4. The Licence stall, as directed by the I.A.M.T., design and/or modify cutting block layouts and road land corder to mitigate land use and access impacts that may be identified through the ernment and public review of proposed activities. Resources and land uses which have be impacted, include but are not limited to:
 - and fish resources;
 - (ii) se tuve, and ened or unique wildlife habitat;
 - (iii) rar threatened or endangered flora and fauna;
 - pro prolatical parks and ecological reserves;
 - (A) herioge resources;
 - (vi) papines;
 - (vii) ocal communities;
 - (yi'' remote lodge and outfitter operations;
 - recreation; and
 - (x) First Nations treaty lands.
- 5. The Licencee shall, as directed by the I.R.M.T., minimize soil disturbance to sensitive areas such as dry upland ridges and wet soils, by scheduling harvesting to avoid times when the sites are sensitive to surface disturbance, and by using harvest methods which will reduce surface disturbance impacts.

6. The Licencee shall:

- (i) comply with the minimum buffer widths set out in "Recommended Buffer Zones for Protecting Fish Resources in Lakes and Streams in Forest Cutting Areas", "Forest Management Guidelines for Wildlife in Manitoba" and any other buffer requirements specified by the I.R.M.
- (ii) design and/or modify buffers to ensure post-harve runoff doe not negatively affect sediment loads in local waterbod as directed by the LR.M.T..
- 7. The Licencee shall not conduct forest management activities in a sestal and buffer, except where the I.R.M.T. conducts a specific is pections agrants approval subject to conditions which will prove environmental and aesthetic qualities.

The Licencee shall:

- ensure a minimum 50 ms, buffer the between harvest areas and Provincial Trunk Psehways anicipal roads, unless directed otherwise by the I.R.M.T.; and
- ensure a minimum 30 her buffs maintained between borrow pits and Provincial fighway or munk pal roads, unless directed otherwise by the M.T..
- 9. The Licencee all erace all materials used in the construction of ice bridges (other than ice or the property), are removed from the site prior to spring break-up.
- 10. The Lic cee shall dis, se of slash and harvesting debris as directed by the

I. The Licen e shall:

- report rare, threatened or endangered species or ecosystems, as prescribed by the I.R.M.T., that are identified during the course of normal pre-harvest and pre-road construction activities; and
- apply measures to protect rare, threatened or endangered species or ecosystems, as directed by the I.R.M.T..

12. The Licencee shall:

- (i) evaluate the potential for the occurrence of heritage resources on areas where forest management activities will occur, and the potential for forest management activities to impact heritage resources, as directed by the I.R.M.T., in consultation with the Historic Resources Brown of the Culture, Heritage and Citizenship; and
- (ii) apply measures to protect heritage resources, as directed by the I.R.M., in consultation with the Historic Resources Branch of Canitoba Culti, Heritage and Citizenship.
- 13. The Licencee shall ensure all-weather or change adds are contructed:
 - (i) to prevent impacts on surface or subsurface age; and
 - (ii) only to the extent required, as deed by the LR.M.?
- 14. The Licencee shall ensure that read construction is done a manner which will prevent erosion, as directed by h. R.M. include, but is not limited to:
 - (i) reducing the slope on side bets of borrow pits, ditches and road shoulders:
 - (ii) minimize gradie and/or sing flow control measures in roadside ditch

15. The Lice cee shall

- (i) clee and/or rehabitate all-weather roads, as directed by the I.R.M.T.;
- co denote and silvicultural activities at each cutting block, as dir ted by the I.R.M.T.; and

16 The Licencee shall:

- (i) site, operate and rehabilitate borrow pits, camp sites, landing sites and garage sites, as directed by the I.R.M.T.;
- (ii) ensure adequate containment protection is implemented for all sites when conducting vehicle or equipment maintenance activities, as directed by the I.R.M.T.;
- (iii) adopt environmentally sensitive servicing techniques including the collection and recycling (or disposal by a means acceptable to Manitoba Environment), of waste oil and anti-freeze;

- (iv) report and clean up spills in excess of 50 liters, as directed by Manitoba Environment's Emergency Response Team;
- (v) dispose of domestic and industrial waste as directed by the I.R.M.T., in consultation with Manitoba Environment.
- 17. The Licencee shall comply with Manitoba Regulation 97/88 Page And Handling Of Gasoline And Associated Products Regulation and Associated Regulation 172/85, "Regulation Respecting The Handling, Lering For Transport And Transporting Of Dangerous Goods".
