THIS LICENCE IS ISSUED TO:

THE PROVINCE OF MANITOBA REPRESENTED BY THE MINISTER OF HIGHWAYS AND TRANSPORTATION: the "Licencee"

for the construction of the Development being the upgrading of Provincial Road #406 from Provincial Trunk Highway #15 to Provincial Trunk Highway #44 located in the Rural Municipality of Whitemouth, subject to the following specifications, terms and conditions:

- 1. The Licencee shall construct the Development in accordance with the Manitoba Department of Highways and Transportation Environment Act Proposal, Proposed Upgrading of Provincial Road 406 from PTH 15 to PTH 44 in the R.M. of Whitemouth, dated June 22, 1995, the drawing titled Realignment Details for 48 302 Long P.P.C.C. & Steel Bridge Over Stoney Creek on Relocated P.R. No. 406 Roadway in Sec. 7-11-12 E R. M. of Whitemouth, filed as additional information to the Environment Act Proposal on March 4, 1996 and Fisheries and Oceans Authorization for Works or Undertakings Affecting Fish Habitat, Authorization No. MB -- 95 097, dated February 9, 1996.
- 2. The Licencee shall construct, as part of the Development, the fish habitat compensation measures as specified under the Authorization for Works or Undertakings Affecting Fish Habitat, Authorization No. MB -- 95 097.
- 3. The Licencee shall, prior to construction, make available a copy of this Licence and the Authorization for Works or Undertakings Affecting Fish Habitat, Authorization No. MB -- 95 097 to all contractors and sub-contractors involved in the Development.
- 4. The Licencee shall, during construction, adhere to the Manitoba Department of Natural Resources guidelines titled Recommended Fish Protection Procedures for Stream Crossings in Manitoba.
- 5. The Licencee shall, during the fish spawning period from April 1 to June 15th of each year during construction, cease construction activities that will impact upon Stoney Creek.
- 6. The Licencee shall, during construction and until vegetation is established, use erosion check devices on the streambanks and highway embankments adjacent to Stoney Creek where the vegetation cover has been disturbed by construction activities.

- 7. The Licencee shall, during construction, ensure that fuel storage and fueling areas established for the construction of the Development are located a minimum distance of 100 meters away from the high water line of Stoney Creek and shall comply with the requirements of Manitoba Regulation 97/88R respecting Storage and Handling of Gasoline and Associated Products.
- 8. The Licencee shall, during the full term of the construction of the Development, cleanup and deposit all debris from the construction site at a Waste Disposal Ground operating under the authority of a permit pursuant to the *Manitoba Waste Disposal Ground Regulation*, MR 150/91.
- 9. The Licencee shall, at the completion of construction, ensure that the berm and reconstructed creek channel are stabilized from channel level to high water elevation at bank-full conditions.

REVOCATION

If in the opinion of the Director, the Licencee has exceeded or is exceeding the limits, or has not or is not complying with the specifications, terms and conditions set out herein, the Director may revoke temporarily or permanently, this Licence.
