- 1) The place shall ensure that at any point of impingement of the place premises the atmosphere contains less than seven (7) podour units per standard cubic foot,
- 2) The an least shall ensure that a high standard of maintenance and housekeeping is carried out at all times in all parts of the premises so as to meet the requirement of clause 1),
- 3) The applicant shall inform the Clean Environment Commission in writing before proceeding with any change in the nature of the operation or any expansion of the operation which may affect the quality of the environment off the plant site.
