Campground Tips

- Be Wildlife Smart. Do not feed any wildlife, including birds or squirrels. You are in black bear country secure all attractants such as food, cooking equipment and trash in a locked vehicle. Do not store food or attractants in your tent.
- Practice Leave No Trace.
 Pack out all gear and trash to keep the campsites clean for others.
- Keep dogs on leash and clean up after your pet.
- Learn to recognize and avoid poisonous plants such as poison ivy.
- Open fires are prohibited.
 Use portable stoves or fire pits provided.
- Don't Move Firewood -Moving firewood can spread harmful invasive species and destroy our forests.
- Prevent the spread of aquatic invasive species. Always clean, drain, dry watercraft and water related equipment. Visit manitoba.ca/stopais for full regulations.
- In case of injury or illness contact a Park Attendant or Park Patrol Officer. They can assist you to reach medical help.

Situated in the rolling hills of southwestern Manitoba



Within the rolling hills of southwestern Manitoba is Rivers Provincial Park. This park consists of 38 hectares of mixed grass prairie, is located on lake Wahtopanah, a reservoir that was created by damming the Little Saskatchewan River. The name "Wahtopanah" comes from the native word meaning "canoe people". Rivers was named in 1908 after Sir Charles Rivers Wilson, Chairman of the Board of Directors of the Grand Trunk Pacific Railway.

After your arrival, have a picnic at your site, or spend the afternoon on the beach. For those who like to spend time in the great outdoors, launch your boat on Lake Wahtopanah and fish for pike, walleye and perch. A playground, beach facilities and concession are also on site. Larger groups can hold their event in the group use area of the park.

The town of Rivers is less than three kilometres away, and offers visitors access to golf, tennis, badminton, baseball, boating, fishing and other water sports. Annual events held in and around Rivers are the Fishing Derby in June, the town wide yard sale on the second Saturday in June and the Agricultural Rivers Fair held the first week of July.

The early pioneers whose hard work built the community and made our area rich in history with community spirit and growth are honoured at the Clack Family Heritage Museum. The Clack Family Heritage Museum is a unique pioneer museum that boasts a collection of antique automobiles, equipment, and artifacts.
