Campground Tips

- Be Wildlife Smart. Do not feed any wildlife, including birds or squirrels. You are in black bear country secure all attractants such as food, cooking equipment and trash in a locked vehicle. Do not store food or attractants in your tent.
- Practice Leave No Trace.
 Pack out all gear and trash to keep the campsites clean for others.
- Keep dogs on leash and clean up after your pet.
- Learn to recognize and avoid poisonous plants such as poison ivy.
- Open fires are prohibited.
 Use portable stoves or fire pits provided.
- Don't Move Firewood -Moving firewood can spread harmful invasive species and destroy our forests.
- Prevent the spread of aquatic invasive species.
 Always clean, drain, dry watercraft and water related equipment. Visit manitoba.ca/stopais for full regulations.
- In case of injury or illness contact a Park Attendant or Park Patrol Officer. They can assist you to reach medical help.

On your way to a spectacular view of southwestern Manitoba



William Lake Campground offers 43 basic campsites and two small group use areas. The campground is equipped with all the amenities you'll need for your outdoor adventure, including a water supply, firewood, modern washrooms, showers, picnic area, picnic shelters and a fish cleaning area. A playground, volleyball court, and horseshoe pitch add to the day's fun. William Lake has a swimming and beach area. Three boat docks are located around William Lake. Electric motors only are allowed on the lake.

Explore Turtle's Back Trail on your way to Turtle's Back Summit and a spectacular view of southwestern Manitoba including the International Peace Garden. This trail passes through Turtle Mountain Community Pasture where local livestock roam and graze. Steep elevation near the summit makes this trail a challenging yet rewarding hike.

William Lake Campground is located east of Highway # 10 and south of Highway #3.
